

9. ADVERSE CIRCUMSTANCES

9.1 The Principal of a recognised educational institution should report to the Council through the Local Registrar on the school performance of candidates with disabilities.

9.2 The Principal of a recognized educational institution should report to the Council through the Local Registrar on the school performance of those candidates whose examination performance is likely to be or may have been affected by adverse circumstances before or during the examination.

9.3 The reports (see Regulations 9.1 and 9.2) must be submitted in the prescribed manner on Form EXA 52 on or before January 31 in respect of the January sitting and on or before June 30 in respect of May/June sitting. Reports submitted after these dates will not be considered.

9.4 Supervisors will report to the Council through the Local Registrar any adverse circumstances which are likely to affect the performance of any candidate in the examination room, whether or not a report has been made under Regulations 9.1 and 9.2. Local Registrars, in cases of illness, must obtain through the Principal of the recognized educational institution a medical certificate which should be forwarded to the Registrar.

9.5 Candidates with physical disabilities who wish to have special arrangements made for them to take the examination should at the time of registration make these requests on the prescribed Form EXA 51.

9.6 Candidates who have been exposed to any infectious disease will not be permitted to enter any examination centre unless they produce a medical certificate indicating that they are out of quarantine.
